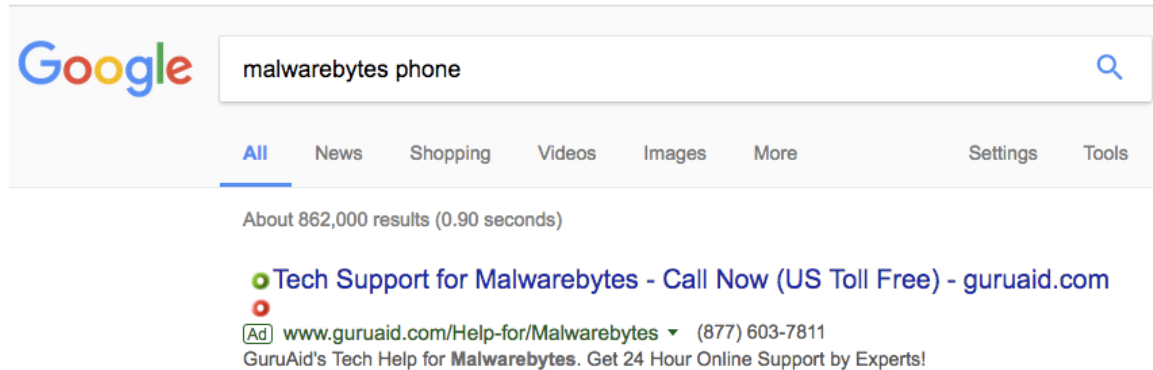


Examples of bad things...

A) Google search (for “malwarebytes phone”)

The top result, as rated by Web of Trust, is that it’s a really bad site (the red dot).

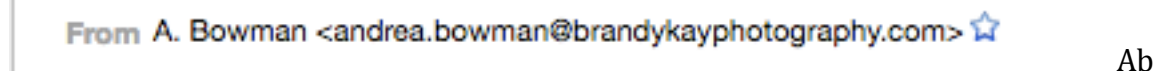
Secondly, note that it has the little **Ad** symbol – it is an advertisement Google is paid to show. I would recommend NEVER clicking on any ad.



B) Email – fake sender. I see this in my list of messages.



But then when I open the message, I see this for the sender info:



solutely no reason why someone from a photography site would be sending me a message about a pre-loaded Discover card...

C) Bad spelling and grammar, slightly off... Notice the extra space before “visit here,” the “price of *fairs*” and “Is our seating comfortable and *up spacious*.”
